## What is Model United Nations (MUN)?

Model United Nations is a simulation of international conferences in which each participant plays a role of a delegate of UN Member State. While playing the role of delegates and pursuing their representing countries' national interests, the participants make speeches, negotiate with allies and adversaries, and prepare draft resolutions. The goal of the conference is to adopt resolutions to resolve problems that affect countries all over the world.



## What is the National MUN Conference?

The National Model United Nations Conference is the world's largest college-level Model United Nations conference. Every year, it brings over 3,000 delegates to New York City to take part in one out of more than 20 committees. NMUN is sponsored by the National Collegiate Conference Association of the United States.



## The policies of Argentina in NMUN

In preparation for the 2013 NMUN Conference, nine students representing Argentina will make the presentation on the position and policies regarding the agenda their committee was assigned. Although the presentation itself will not be used in the actual conference, the contents of their presentation will be the basis of their diplomatic strategy and policy, which will be reflected in their speeches, negotiation process, and draft resolutions. Each 15 minute- long presentation is followed by 20 minutes of feedback. We ask for comments on the whether the policy is feasible, realistic, or creative and whether the logic from the analysis of the problem to the solution is understandable. Moreover, comments on the policy with relation to the national interest of the country are highly appreciated, as well as any other constructive criticism.
